PROGRAM NOTE

And What Happens If I Don't? The speculative question that serves at this play's title is as rich, and elusive as the figures that populate the story. Part provocation, part carefully articulated act of resistance, part wild re-construction of the past, And What Happens If I Don't? offers a kaleidoscopic range of possibilities while deferring consequences. IF. If I resist, if I cross that line, if I don't conform, don't belong, find myself too far from home...what then?

Fragmented memories make up the narrative, moving from a girlhood in a "former communist country with a well-developed brutalist architecture" to an adulthood spent searching for a place "far away from everything." The stories unfold almost nomadically, adrift from the here and now of some unidentified present—a place where the narrator cannot find herself. The play is, in a sense, a series of small journeys with unexpected turns and startling border crossings. But these vignettes are not directionless, despite their meandering nature. Like a carefully laid trail of breadcrumbs in the woods, they lead us... somewhere. To a question. What if?

This play is the second production in The Cherry's season-long exploration of migration, survival,

identity, displacement, and notions of home. These themes are all here, presented with humor, compassion and irony. And What Happens If I Don't? has sparked much conversation between members of The Cherry team, our work-study students, the cast and crew. We have reflected on our own mothers: their insights, their warnings, their ability to shape us. We have reflected on our various relationships to authority, from school dress codes, to institutionalized racism, and on access to power in medicine and religion. And we have reflected on that thorny question: what if? What if someone or something stops us at the borders of knowledge and experience? What if we find ourselves displaced, invisible to others and to ourselves?

We hope this production serves as an invitation to reflect on the territories that are mapped in this story, familiar and strange, painful and funny. And we invite you to reflect on the themes of displacement, identity and authority. And most importantly, perhaps, after you have taken this theatrical journey, we offer you a question to ponder: where do you find yourself?
